

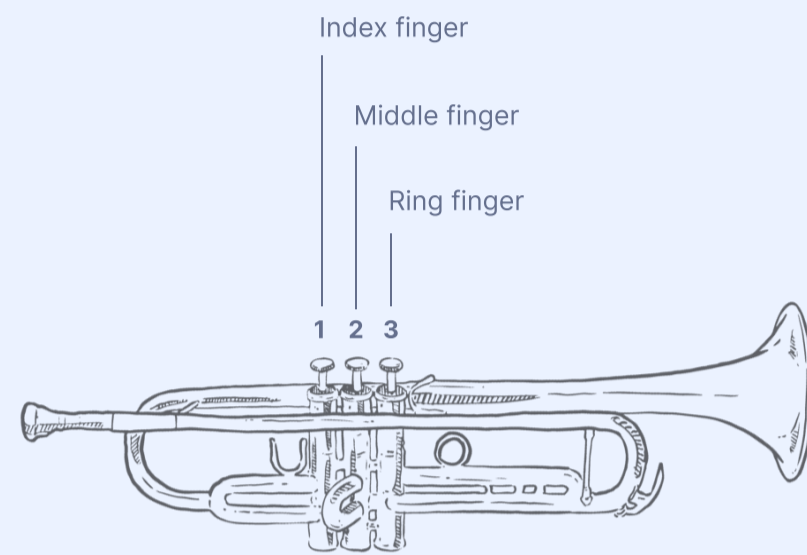
Trumpet fingering chart

How to read a fingering chart

The trumpet has three valves: 1, 2, and 3, as you can see in the image below.

The fingering chart indicates which valves you should press with numbers. The possible combinations are:

- 0 = no valves are pressed
- 1 = valve 1 is pressed
- 2 = valve 2 is pressed
- 3 = valve 3 is pressed
- 1 2 = valves 1 and 2 are pressed
- 1 3 = valves 1 and 3 are pressed
- 2 3 = valves 2 and 3 are pressed
- 1 2 3 = valves 1, 2 and 3 are pressed



The Chromatic Scale Chart

Trompet

- Staff 5: C# (1), D (2), D# (2), E (0), F (1), F# (2), G (2)
- Staff 6: G# (2 3), A (2 3), A# (1 2), B (1), C (1), C# (2), D (0)
